Re: Freedom of Information Act Request

Dear Ms. Magnuszewska:

On August 5, 2016, the Village of Elmwood Park received your Illinois Freedom of Information Act (5 ILCS 140/1 *et seq.*) ("FOIA") request for "16-885[.]"

Enclosed please find the records responsive to your FOIA request. However, please be advised that certain information in the records responsive to your FOIA request has been determined to be exempt from disclosure under FOIA. Accordingly, such information has been redacted from the records being provided.

Section 7(1)(b) of FOIA provides that "private information" is exempt from disclosure. "Private information" is defined in FOIA as, "unique identifiers, including a person's social security number, driver's license number, employee identification number, biometric identifiers, personal financial information, passwords or other access codes, medical records, home or personal telephone numbers, and personal email addresses. Private information also includes home address and personal license plates, except as otherwise provided by law or when compiled without possibility of attribution to any person." 5 ILCS 140/2(c-5). Consequently, certain unique identifiers, including home or personal telephone numbers, home addresses, and a personal license plate, have been redacted from the records being provided.

Section 7(1)(c) of FOIA provides that, "[p]ersonal information contained within public records, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy" is exempt from disclosure. Consequently, birthdates, and other personal information, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, including the name of a third party who incidentally appears in a police report, and the races of individuals, have been redacted from the records being provided.

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Section 7(1)(d)(iv) of FOIA provides that, “[r]ecords in the possession of any public body created in the course of administrative enforcement proceedings, and any law enforcement or correctional agency for law enforcement purposes” are exempt from disclosure, “but only to the extent that disclosure would: ... unavoidably disclose the identity of a confidential source, confidential information furnished only by the confidential source, or persons who file complaints with or provide information to administrative, investigative, law enforcement, or penal agencies.” Consequently, information that would reveal the identity of persons who filed complaints with or provided information to the Village of Elmwood Park Police Department has been redacted from the records being provided.

The person responsible for the decision to deny a portion of your FOIA request is the Village of Elmwood Park Freedom of Information Officer, Gina Pesko. In accordance with Section 9(a) of FOIA, you are hereby notified that you have the right to file a Request for Review regarding the decision made by the Village of Elmwood Park Freedom of Information Officer with the Public Access Counselor at the Illinois Attorney General’s Office. On 08/03/16, at 2037 hours, I was summoned to the Elmwood Park Police station for a report. Upon my arrival, I spoke to the complainant, [REDACTED], f [REDACTED], who told me the following in summary:

[REDACTED] said she is still in the process of getting a divorce from her husband, [REDACTED], m [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] has not lived with them since 2011 and is now currently residing at [REDACTED] in Elmwood Park.

[REDACTED] said on 08/03/16, at approximately 2000 hours, she was notified by her daughter, [REDACTED], f [REDACTED] was following [REDACTED] in his vehicle, Illinois registration # [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] said she brought her daughter to the station to make a police report.

I spoke to [REDACTED], who was upset and crying, and told me the following in summary:

[REDACTED] said on 08/03/16, at approximately 2000 hours, she left her residence to go get ice cream. [REDACTED] said as she was going to get ice cream, she observed a silver Toyota 4-Runner, which appeared to be [REDACTED] vehicle, following her around everywhere she went. [REDACTED] arrived at Dunkin Donuts and still observed the vehicle in the area.

[REDACTED] left the Dunkin Donuts and continued to see the vehicle follow her. [REDACTED] said as she arrived home, she observed the vehicle come to a stop and observed it to be [REDACTED] vehicle. [REDACTED] went into the residence and observed [REDACTED] smiling and laughing in his vehicle, then left in an unknown direction.

[REDACTED] said she and her mother have changed their telephone numbers and have not had contact with [REDACTED] for a long period of time. [REDACTED] said the incident made her feel uncomfortable and fear for her safety. [REDACTED] notified Jadwiga of the incident.

[REDACTED] requested the incident to be documented and was seeking information on how to obtain an order of protection.

I provided [REDACTED] with the report number and the necessary information on how to obtain an order of protection.
