Re: Freedom of Information Act Request

Dear Mr. and Mrs. Schulze:

The Village of Elmwood Park is in receipt of your February 11, 2016, Illinois Freedom of Information Act (5 ILCS 140/1 *et seq.*) ("FOIA") request for "Report # 15-10271[.]"

Enclosed please find the records responsive to your FOIA request. However, please be advised that certain information in the records responsive to your FOIA request has been determined to be exempt from disclosure under FOIA. Accordingly, such information has been redacted from the records being provided.

Section 7(1)(a) of FOIA provides that, "[i]nformation specifically prohibited from disclosure by federal or State law or rules and regulations implementing federal or State law" is exempt from disclosure. Section 1240.80(d) of Title 20, entitled "Corrections, Criminal Justice, and Law Enforcement," of the Illinois Administrative Code provides that, "LEADS data shall not be disseminated to any individual or organization that is not legally authorized to have access to the information." Consequently, information obtained through the Law Enforcement Agencies Data System ("LEADS") has been redacted from the records being provided.

Section 7(1)(b) of FOIA provides that "private information" is exempt from disclosure. "Private information" is defined in FOIA as, "unique identifiers, including a person's social security number, driver's license number, employee identification number, biometric identifiers, personal financial information, passwords or other access codes, medical records, home or personal telephone numbers, and personal email addresses. Private information also includes home address and personal license plates, except as otherwise provided by law or when compiled

without possibility of attribution to any person.” 5 ILCS 140/2(c-5). Consequently, certain unique identifiers, including a driver’s license number, home or personal telephone numbers, and home addresses, have been redacted from the records being provided.

Section 7(1)(c) of FOIA provides that, “[p]ersonal information contained within public records, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy” is exempt from disclosure. Consequently, birthdates, and other personal information, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, including a victim’s name and identifying information, the names of third-parties who incidentally appear in a police report, and the races of individuals, have been redacted from the records being provided.

Section 7(1)(d)(iv) of FOIA provides that, “[r]ecords in the possession of any public body created in the course of administrative enforcement proceedings, and any law enforcement or correctional agency for law enforcement purposes” are exempt from disclosure, “but only to the extent that disclosure would: ... unavoidably disclose the identity of a confidential source, confidential information furnished only by the confidential source, or persons who file complaints with or provide information to administrative, investigative, law enforcement, or penal agencies.” Consequently, information that would reveal the identity of persons who filed complaints with or who provided information to the Village of Elmwood Park Police Department has been redacted from the records being provided.

The person responsible for the decision to deny a portion of your FOIA request is the Village of Elmwood Park Freedom of Information Officer, Gina Pesko. In accordance with Section 9(a) of FOIA, you are hereby notified that you have the right to file a Request for Review regarding the decision made by the Village of Elmwood Park Freedom of Information Officer with the Public Access Counselor at the Illinois Attorney General’s Office. 

ON 12-21-15 AT 1747 HOURS I RESPONDED TO A PREMISE CHECK, LATER RECLASSIFIED AS A RESIDENTIAL BURGLARY. UPON ARRIVAL I MET WITH CALLER [REDACTED] WHO STATED SHE HAD JUST ARRIVED HOME AND NOTICED HER FRONT AND SIDE DOORS WERE OPEN. SHE SAID SHE HAD OPENED THE FRONT DOOR AND POKED HER HEAD IN, BUT HAD NOT GONE INTO THE RESIDENCE.

SGT BROWN ARRIVED ON SCENE. HE AND I CLEARED THE RESIDENCE, NOT FINDING ANYONE INSIDE. WHILE CLEARING THE RESIDENCE I OBSERVED THE WINDOW OF THE SIDE DOOR HAD BEEN SHATTERED. WE LOCATED [REDACTED] DOG IN THE UPSTAIRS MASTER BEDROOM. I NOTICED OPEN DRAWERS AND JEWELRY LAYING ON THE FLOOR IN THE MASTER BEDROOM. WE RETURNED OUTSIDE THE RESIDENCE AND REQUESTED OFC MARCHI JOIN US ON SCENE AS AN ET.

[REDACTED] STATED HER HUSBAND [REDACTED] HAD LEFT THE HOUSE AT APPROXIMATELY 0545 HOURS. SHE HAD LEFT AT 0720 HOURS. WHEN SHE LEFT, BOTH THE FRONT AND SIDE DOORS WERE CLOSED AND LOCKED. HER DOG IS ALLOWED TO ROAM AROUND THE HOUSE, AND HAD NOT BEEN SECURED IN THE MASTER BEDROOM WHERE WE FOUND HER.

OFC MARCHI AND I WALKED THROUGH THE HOUSE WITH [REDACTED] AND [REDACTED] THEY NOTICED A FULL SIZE IPAD AND ITS CHARGER HAD BEEN TAKEN FROM THE KITCHEN. ITEMS OF FOOD HAD BEEN TAKEN OUT OF THE FRIDGE AND LEFT ON THE FLOOR. IN THE MASTER BEDROOM, SMALL DRAWERS ON TOP OF THEIR DRESSERS HAD BEEN OPENED AND EMPTIED. THE SMALL DRAWERS CONTAINED: [REDACTED] jewelry, [REDACTED] WATCHES, KNIVES, AND MONEY CLIPS. AN UNKNOWN SUM OF CHANGE WAS TAKEN FROM ATOP [REDACTED] DRESSER. A WHITE PILLOW CASE WITH BLACK FLORAL DESIGNS HAD BEEN REMOVED FROM A PILLOW ON THE BED AND TAKEN. [REDACTED] AND [REDACTED] FILLED OUT AN ELMWOOD PARK PD SUPPLEMENTAL PROPERTY SHEET, ITEMIZING EACH MISSING ITEM AND ITS VALUE, AND RETURNED IT TO ME. SEE ATTACHED.

[REDACTED] INFORMED ME THEY ARE IN THE PROCESS OF SELLING THEIR HOME AND HAVE HAD MANY PEOPLE COME TO SEE IT. [REDACTED] STATED THEY ARE NOT USING A REALTOR AND THAT SHE HAD BEEN PERFORMING THE SHOWINGS. SHE HAD RECENTLY DISCARDED THE LIST OF EVERYONE WHO HAD SEEN THE HOUSE. SHE DID HAVE BUSINESS CARDS FOR REALTORS WHO HAD ACCOMPANIED POTENTIAL BUYERS. I PHOTO COPIED THE CARDS. SEE ATTACHED.

WHILE STILL ON SCENE, [REDACTED] UTILIZED THE "FIND MY DEVICE" FEATURE ON HER ICloud. SHE NOTIFIED US THE IPAD'S CURRENT LOCATION WAS APPROXIMATELY 3220 N NEWLAND IN CHICAGO. OFC MARCHI, AUX OFC ROBINSON, AND I RELOCATED TO THAT AREA. I MADE CONTACT WITH [REDACTED] (F [REDACTED]) AT [REDACTED] ADVISED ME SHE IS THE HOME OWNER AND RESIDES THERE WITH HER DAUGHTER [REDACTED] AND GRANDSON [REDACTED] (M [REDACTED]) COOPERATED AND ALLOWED US TO LOOK AROUND. WE DID NOT OBSERVE AND PROCEEDS. WHILE

INSIDE OF 3220 N NEWLAND, OFC MARCHI CONTACTED [REDACTED] AND REQUESTED SHE ACTIVATE THE "ALERT" FEATURE ON HER IPAD. WHILE SPEAKING WITH HER SHE INFORMED HIM THE DEVICE WAS NOW SHOWING FURTHER SOUTH OF 3220, CLOSER TO 3200 N NEWLAND.

On 12/21/2015 at 1830 hours I responded to 1612 77th Ct to complete evidence work for a burglary.

Upon arrival I met with Sgt Brown and Ofc Logisz already on scene.

I conducted a walkthrough of the exterior of the premise with Sgt Brown. I observed no evidence to be collected around the exterior of the premise, including foot impressions or fingerprints.

I then conducted a walkthrough of the interior of the residence with Ofc Logisz. The point of entry was determined to be the south side door. The glass was shattered to the interior floor of the kitchen. The door had a double keyed deadbolt lock, so the suspect/s had to make entry by climbing through the window. It appeared the point of exit was the front entry door which was discovered open upon the return of the residents. The house was clearly disturbed as many objects did not appear to be in an organized placement.

I then conducted a walkthrough of the interior of the residence with the victims and Ofc Logisz. The victims were able to describe what items were out of place, what items may have been handled by the suspects, and what was missing. See Ofc Logisz report for further.

I took photographs of the interior and exterior of the crime scene and collected a black and white ceramic bowl from the top of a dresser which was against the north wall in the south master bedroom. I processed the bowl in the Elmwood Park police crime lab, developed a partial latent fingerprint on the inside rim of the bowl, but was unable to develop a quality print for comparison. The bowl was later returned to the owner.

The photographs were saved to disk and placed in the BEAST evidence inventory system.

I completed all necessary reports and returned to duty.

I contacted [redacted] for a description of the items missing from her home. [redacted] emailed me a spreadsheet of items missing from her home [redacted] advised she used the "Find my Ipad" application and the app was showing her Ipad at "3200 N. Newland Ave" in Chicago.

12-24-15

[redacted] emailed me advising she just noticed she is missing a silverware set. [redacted] said the set was "Community" brand and had enough silverware to serve at least 24.

12-27-15

[redacted] emailed me advising the Find My Ipad app was now showing a location of 17719 Noreen Ct., Gurnee, IL.

01-02-16

[redacted] emailed me to advise the Find My Ipad app was now showing a location of 6940 W. Melrose St., Chicago, IL.

01-06-15

[redacted] I contacted Chicago PD District 16 Ofc. Gnoit #9556 to find out more about the arrest. Ofc. Gnoit advised Grimaldi was in possession of numerous other items which have not been claimed. Ofc. Gnoit recalled a Mickey Mouse watch and a Goffy watch which were inventoried. I checked the items listed by [redacted] Schulze and saw a Mickey Mouse watch and Goofy Watch on the list.

Det. Winiarczyk and I went to Chicago District 16 police station. We spoke with Ofc. Gnoit and Ofc. Johnson #6015. They showed us the property removed from the possession of Patrick Grimaldi m [redacted] when he was arrested. I photographed the items and emailed the photos to [redacted] I spoke to [redacted] and she advised almost all the items belonged to her. Ofc. Johnson advised [redacted] needed to come to District 16 to retrieve her missing goods. [redacted] agreed to do so at a later date.

Det. Winiarczyk and I went to Cash America and spoke to Assistant Manager [redacted] showed me the items pawned under the name Patrick Grimaldi. There were four (4) watches sold to the shop under two different

transactions. I photographed the items. [redacted] said she could retrieve the video recordings of the transactions to be picked up at a later date.

I went to speak to [redacted] at his home. I showed [redacted] pictures of the four watches and he advised only two of them belonged to him.

The watches taken from [redacted] home were both Skagen brand, sold to Cash America under the name Patrick Grimaldi, ticket #7669* on 01-04-16.

I completed a "hold" request to Cash America for the two Skagen watches under ticket #7669.

01-07-16

I went to Cash America Pawn and spoke to [redacted] turned over the two Skagen watches to me.

Det. Astrella and I went to [redacted] and spoke to [redacted] (m [redacted] [redacted] said he knows Patrick Grimaldi's sister. [redacted] said she asked him to allow Patrick to stay with him because he has no home. [redacted] said Patrick started living in the southwest bedroom a few days before Christmas. [redacted] said he had an argument with Patrick several days ago and Patrick began to sleep in a car behind the building.

[redacted] pointed out a plastic bag containing Patrick's personal belongings. In the bag I located the following items :

- small black box containing one Reflections Pen
- small box containing two Parker pens
- small gift box containing two wooden style pens - gift tag inside box made out to [redacted]
- one Apple charging cord with wall plug
- one set of used Apple earbuds
- one Mickey Mouse pin
- one pin of an Angel with three charms

In the bag there were some other personal items including a pair of gloves, a blackhawks knit hat, some tobacco, a lighter and some other items. Next to the bag were two tool boxes. We looked through the tools with [redacted] and found a small pineapple shaped jewelry holder and a small gift box shaped jewelry holder. Inside one of the boxes was a rosary type beaded chain with a cross. I located a large folding knife in one tool box.

██████████ walked us back to the the bedroom where he allowed Patrick to stay. In the bedroom on a table I located a small knife sheath with two small folding knives. I asked ██████████ if he ever saw Patrick with a vacuum cleaner. ██████████ went to his closet and pulled out an older model Oreck vacuum cleaner and handed it to me.

I photographed all the items collected from ██████████ apartment.

We explained to ██████████ our victim's Ipad was "located" using an application and showed an address of 3200 N. Newland Ave. ██████████ helped us look through his apartment and allowed us to look into his storage area in the basement of the building. ██████████ said Patrick did not have access to the storage area but it is possible for Patrick to hide items anywhere in the building.

Det. Astrella and I were unable to locate the Ipad.

Det. Astrella and I went to 6949 W. Melrose which is across the alley from 3200 Newland. We spoke to the homeowner who allowed us to check his back yard to see if we could find the Ipad but we did not locate it. Det. Astrella and I checked numerous garbage cans and dumpsters in the alley of the area of 3200 Newland but were unable to locate the Ipad.

01-08-16

Det. Astrella and Det. Winiarczyk went to Cash America Pawn to retrieve video recording from the store and conduct a photo lineup. See Det. Astrella's report.

01-10-16

I went to RJ Jewelry 1210 Bloomingdale Rd, Glendale Hts, IL and spoke to owner, ██████████ said he recalls the transaction which he conducted with Patrick Grimaldi. ██████████ showed me a picture on his computer of Patrick Grimaldi's driver's license. ██████████ said Patrick presented his driver's license when he sold the ring to RJ Jewelry. Patrick showed me a picture of the ring on his computer. I took pictures of the ring and of Patrick's driver's license.

██████████ said he could identify the subject who made the transaction if he saw him again. ██████████ signed a refusal to be recorded form and a photo lineup form. ██████████ positively identified Patrick Grimaldi in the photo lineup as the person who sold him the ring on 12-22-15.

██████████ gave me a recording of the transaction with Patrick Grimaldi from 12-22-15 from the video surveillance equipment in his store.

01-11-16

I showed ██████████ photos of the items recovered from ██████████ apartment. ██████████ identified all the property as her own. She was very excited the angel pin and said the knives belong to her husband.

I went to see ██████████. I showed ██████████ the picture of the ring. ██████████ identified the ring as being her own. I explained to ██████████ the ring has already been melted and I was not able to recover it.
