Re: Freedom of Information Act Request

Dear Ms. LaVere:

On March 2, 2016, the Village of Elmwood Park received your Illinois Freedom of Information Act (5 ILCS 140/1 *et seq.*) ("FOIA") request for "# 16-00466[.]"

Enclosed please find the records responsive to your FOIA request. However, please be advised that certain information in the records responsive to your FOIA request has been determined to be exempt from disclosure under FOIA. Accordingly, such information has been redacted from the records being provided.

Section 7(1)(b) of FOIA provides that "private information" is exempt from disclosure. "Private information" is defined in FOIA as, "unique identifiers, including a person's social security number, driver's license number, employee identification number, biometric identifiers, personal financial information, passwords or other access codes, medical records, home or personal telephone numbers, and personal email addresses. Private information also includes home address and personal license plates, except as otherwise provided by law or when compiled without possibility of attribution to any person." 5 ILCS 140/2(c-5). Consequently, certain unique identifiers, including home or personal telephone numbers, and home addresses, have been redacted from the records being provided.

Section 7(1)(c) of FOIA provides that, "[p]ersonal information contained within public records, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy" is exempt from disclosure. Consequently, birthdates, and other personal information, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, including the name of a third-party who incidentally appears in a police report, and the races of individuals, have been redacted from the records being provided.

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Section 7(1)(d)(iv) of FOIA provides that, “[r]ecords in the possession of any public body created in the course of administrative enforcement proceedings, and any law enforcement or correctional agency for law enforcement purposes” are exempt from disclosure, “but only to the extent that disclosure would: ... unavoidably disclose the identity of a confidential source, confidential information furnished only by the confidential source, or persons who file complaints with or provide information to administrative, investigative, law enforcement, or penal agencies.” Consequently, information that would reveal the identity of persons who filed complaints with or provided information to the Village of Elmwood Park Police Department has been redacted from the records being provided.

The person responsible for the decision to deny a portion of your FOIA request is the Village of Elmwood Park Freedom of Information Officer, Gina Pesko. In accordance with Section 9(a) of FOIA, you are hereby notified that you have the right to file a Request for Review regarding the decision made by the Village of Elmwood Park Freedom of Information Officer with the Public Access Counselor at the Illinois Attorney General’s Office. You can file your Request for Review with the Public Access Counselor by writing to:



THE INFORMATION BELOW IS CONFIDENTIAL - FOR USE BY AUTHORIZED PERSONNEL ONLY

ON 02-26-16 AT 1806 HOURS I WAS DISPATCHED TO THE STATION TO TAKE A THREAT REPORT, LATER RECLASSIFIED AS A SUSPICIOUS INCIDENT.

I SPOKE WITH [REDACTED] WHO STATED HE HAD COME TO THE PD TO PICK UP HIS SON [REDACTED] (M [REDACTED]) FROM HIS EX WIFE [REDACTED] (F [REDACTED]). [REDACTED] STATED HE AND [REDACTED] HAVE BEEN SEPARATED FOR APPROXIMATELY 2 YEARS. THERE IS NO OFFICIAL CUSTODY PAPERWORK IN PLACE, AND THE TWO HAVE AN INFORMAL ARRANGEMENT WHERE [REDACTED] TAKES [REDACTED] EVERY OTHER WEEKEND. ON HIS LAWYER'S ADVICE, [REDACTED] PICKS UP [REDACTED] FROM [REDACTED] IN THE LOBBY OF THE ELMWOOD PARK POLICE DEPARTMENT.

WHEN THE TWO HAD MET IN THE LOBBY AT APPROXIMATELY 1800 HOURS, [REDACTED] ADVISED [REDACTED] [REDACTED] HAD A BURN ON HIS HAND THAT HAD BEEN CAUSED BY MELTED CHEESE FROM A QUESADILLA. WHEN [REDACTED] OBSERVED THE SIZABLE BURN ON [REDACTED] HAND HE ATTEMPTED TO QUESTION [REDACTED] FURTHER ABOUT HOW IT HAD BEEN CAUSED. HE STATED [REDACTED] LOST HER TEMPER AND SHOUTED "DON'T FUCKING TALK TO ME LIKE THAT!" [REDACTED] SAID SHE THEN "THREATENED" HIM, SAYING "I'M COMING TO YOUR HOUSE TONIGHT." AND "I'M CALLING DCFS ON YOU." AFTER [REDACTED] LEFT THE PD [REDACTED] REPORTED THE INCIDENT TO CSO TRISTANO AND REQUESTED A REPORT BE GENERATED.

AFTER SPEAKING WITH [REDACTED] I LOOKED AT THE BURN ON [REDACTED] LEFT HAND, NOTING IT WAS RED, SWOLLEN, AND SCABBED OVER. I REQUESTED EPFD PARAMEDICS BE DISPATCHED TO THE STATION. EPFD MEDICS INSPECTED THE BURN AND STATED THEY DID NOT BELIEVE IT COULD HAVE BEEN CAUSED BY HOT CHEESE. I PHOTOGRAPHED THE BURN, AND THE EPFD MEDICS PLACED A BANDAGE OVER IT.

AT 1852 HOURS I MADE CONTACT WITH [REDACTED] AT [REDACTED] [REDACTED] STATED [REDACTED] HAD RECEIVED THE BURN ON HIS HAND ON WEDNESDAY, 02-24-16. SHE SAID SHE HAD PLACED A QUESADILLA FRESH OFF THE STOVE ONTO A PLATE IN FRONT OF [REDACTED] CHEESE FROM THE QUESADILLA SPILLED OUT ONTO [REDACTED] HAND. SHE STATED SHE HAD NOT TAKEN HIM TO THE EMERGENCY ROOM. SHE APPLIED NEOSPORIN TO THE BURNED SKIN AND COVERED IT FOR 1 DAY.

ON 02-27-16 AT APPROXIMATELY 1500 HOURS I SPOKE ON THE PHONE WITH CHRIS BROWN FROM DCFS. I WAS PROVIDED WITH DCFS INCIDENT #13169785.
