**Re: Freedom of Information Act Request**

Dear Mr. Principe:

On October 17, 2016, the Village of Elmwood Park received your Illinois Freedom of Information Act (5 ILCS 140/1 *et seq.*) ("FOIA") request for "16-2537[.]"

Enclosed please find the records responsive to your FOIA request. However, please be advised that certain information in the records responsive to your FOIA request has been determined to be exempt from disclosure under FOIA. Accordingly, such information has been redacted from the records being provided.

Section 7(1)(b) of FOIA provides that "private information" is exempt from disclosure. "Private information" is defined in FOIA as, "unique identifiers, including a person's social security number, driver's license number, employee identification number, biometric identifiers, personal financial information, passwords or other access codes, medical records, home or personal telephone numbers, and personal email addresses. Private information also includes home address and personal license plates, except as otherwise provided by law or when compiled without possibility of attribution to any person." 5 ILCS 140/2(c-5). Consequently, certain unique identifiers, including home or personal telephone numbers, and home addresses, have been redacted from the records being provided.

Section 7(1)(c) of FOIA provides that, "[p]ersonal information contained within public records, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy" is exempt from disclosure. Consequently, birthdates, and other personal information, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, including the names of third parties who incidentally appear in a police report, and the races of individuals, have been redacted from the records being provided.

Section 7(1)(d)(iv) of FOIA provides that, "[r]ecords in the possession of any public body created in the course of administrative enforcement proceedings, and any law enforcement or correctional agency

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for law enforcement purposes” are exempt from disclosure, “but only to the extent that disclosure would: ... unavoidably disclose the identity of a confidential source, confidential information furnished only by the confidential source, or persons who file complaints with or provide information to administrative, investigative, law enforcement, or penal agencies.” Consequently, information that would reveal the identity of persons who filed complaints with or provided information to the Village of Elmwood Park Police Department has been redacted from the records being provided.

The person responsible for the decision to deny a portion of your FOIA request is the Village of Elmwood Park Freedom of Information Officer, Gina Pesko. In accordance with Section 9(a) of FOIA, you are hereby notified that you have the right to file a Request for Review regarding the decision made by the Village of Elmwood Park Freedom of Information Officer with the Public Access Counselor at the Illinois Attorney General’s Office. If you choose to file a Request for Review with the Public Access Counselor, you must do so within 60 calendar days of the date of this letter. Please note that you must include a copy of your original FOIA request and this letter when filing a Request for Review with the Public Access Counselor.

You are also notified that you have the right to judicial review regarding the decision made by the Village of Elmwood Park Freedom of Information Officer pursuant to Section 11 of FOIA.

On 10/15/2016, at 1702 hours, Officer Zelasco and I responded to 1723 N. 78th Avenue, for a neighbor dispute in progress. Upon our arrival, I spoke to the complainant, [REDACTED] m [REDACTED] who told me the following in summary:

[REDACTED] said he was leaving his daughter's [REDACTED] residence when he was approached by his daughter's neighbor [REDACTED] m [REDACTED] who resides at [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] approached him in an aggressive manner, got into his face, and stated, "This isn't over, I am going to get you." [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] had to separate him and [REDACTED] to prevent further conflict. [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] wife, [REDACTED] f [REDACTED] was also on the property during the incident.

[REDACTED] said his daughter [REDACTED] and her husband, [REDACTED] m [REDACTED] are in the process of getting a divorce. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] have been speaking with [REDACTED] and sided with him in regards to the divorce. [REDACTED] believes [REDACTED] approached him due to a previous incident in which [REDACTED] claims [REDACTED] yelled profanities toward [REDACTED] (See RD#16-2080).

I asked [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] what course of action would she like our agency to take. [REDACTED] stated he did not want the incident investigated and did not want to pursue the matter criminally. [REDACTED] stated he just wanted the [REDACTED] family to stay off [REDACTED] property and to have no contact with any member of his family.

[REDACTED] requested me to speak with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] in regards to the incident and advise them they are not to come on her property and have no contact with her family by any means.

[REDACTED] stated she will be in contact with her attorney in regards to obtaining an order of protection.

Officer Zelasco and I went to [REDACTED] and spoke with [REDACTED] in regards to the incident. [REDACTED] related the following in summary:

[REDACTED] said [REDACTED] did go onto [REDACTED] property and confronted [REDACTED] because [REDACTED] has made threatening statements to her in the past (related to RD#16-2080). I advised [REDACTED] to not go onto [REDACTED] property and her and [REDACTED] are to have no contact with [REDACTED] family.

[REDACTED] said she does not want to have any contact with [REDACTED] family. [REDACTED] advised [REDACTED] is currently at church and would relay the information I told her in regards to the incident.

I attempted to contact [REDACTED] via telephone with negative results.
