**Re: Freedom of Information Act Request**

Dear Mr. Chundi:

On February 10, 2017, the Village of Elmwood Park received your Freedom of Information Act (5 ILCS 140/1 *et seq.*) ("FOIA") request for the following records:

"Police investigation. Report from Officer Brand. Case Number 17-100."

Your request has been granted in part and denied in part. Enclosed are records responsive to your FOIA request. However, please be advised that certain information in the records being provided has been determined to be exempt from disclosure under FOIA, and that information has been redacted from the records being provided.

Section 7 (1) (b) of FOIA provides that "private information" is exempt from disclosure. "Private information" is defined in FOIA as, "unique identifiers, including a person's social security number, driver's license number, VIN, employee identification number, biometric identifiers, personal financial information, passwords or other access codes, medical records, home or personal telephone numbers, and personal email addresses. Private information also includes home address and personal license plates, except as otherwise provided by law or when compiled without possibility of attribution to any person." 5 ILCS 140/2(c-5). Consequently, certain unique identifiers, including names attributable to home address, driver's license number, VIN, personal license plates, employee identification numbers, home or personal telephone numbers, and home addresses have been redacted from the records being provided.

The person responsible for the decision to deny a portion of your FOIA request is the Village of Elmwood Park Freedom of Information Officer, Gina Pesko. In accordance with Section 9(a) of FOIA, you are hereby notified that you have the right to file a Request for Review regarding the decision made by the Village of Elmwood Park Freedom of Information Officer with the Public Access Counselor at the Illinois Attorney General's Office. On 02-06-17, Vishnu Chuni (registered owner of vehicle) and his son Kai Chuni came to our station in response to a hit and run letter i sent them.

Kai told me he believed he remember this incident. He was driving his father's vehicle IL [REDACTED] southbound on Harlem Av stopped at the intersection with North Av. Kai told me he was about 1 car length behind the vehicle in front of him. He saw an older black woman get out the car and look at her bumper and then stare at him for a while. Kai told me he never made contact with her vehicle with his. Kai said he has photographs of the car now and last year time stamped to prove there is no damage. Kai said after he realized the woman was not going to move, he drove around her and headed home.

Kai provided me with his insurance information for the vehicle (Amica Auto; policy # 900F12-20EP) and his driver's license. Kai and Vishnu told me they already contacted their insurance to clear up this claim and provided the photographs to them as well.
