Re: Freedom of Information Act Request

Dear Ms. Arancillo:

On January 23, 2017, the Village of Elmwood Park received your Illinois Freedom of Information Act (5 ILCS 140/1 *et seq.*) ("FOIA") request for "16-1991[.]"

Enclosed please find the records responsive to your FOIA request. However, please be advised that certain information in the records responsive to your FOIA request has been determined to be exempt from disclosure under FOIA. Accordingly, such information has been redacted from the records being provided.

Section 7(1)(b) of FOIA provides that "private information" is exempt from disclosure. "Private information" is defined in FOIA as, "unique identifiers, including a person's social security number, driver's license number, employee identification number, biometric identifiers, personal financial information, passwords or other access codes, medical records, home or personal telephone numbers, and personal email addresses. Private information also includes home address and personal license plates, except as otherwise provided by law or when compiled without possibility of attribution to any person." 5 ILCS 140/2(c-5). Consequently, certain unique identifiers, including home or personal telephone numbers, and home addresses, have been redacted from the records being provided.

Section 7(1)(c) of FOIA provides that, "[p]ersonal information contained within public records, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy" is exempt from disclosure. Consequently, birthdates, and other personal information, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, including the names of third parties who incidentally appear in police reports, and the races of individuals, have been redacted from the records being provided.

Section 7(1)(d)(iv) of FOIA provides that, "[r]ecords in the possession of any public body created in the course of administrative enforcement proceedings, and any law enforcement or correctional agency

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for law enforcement purposes” are exempt from disclosure, “but only to the extent that disclosure would: ... unavoidably disclose the identity of a confidential source, confidential information furnished only by the confidential source, or persons who file complaints with or provide information to administrative, investigative, law enforcement, or penal agencies.” Consequently, information that would reveal the identity of persons who filed complaints with or provided information to the Village of Elmwood Park Police Department has been redacted from the records being provided.

The person responsible for the decision to deny a portion of your FOIA request is the Village of Elmwood Park Freedom of Information Officer, Gina Pesko. In accordance with Section 9(a) of FOIA, you are hereby notified that you have the right to file a Request for Review regarding the decision made by the Village of Elmwood Park Freedom of Information Officer with the Public Access Counselor at the Illinois Attorney General’s Office. You can file your Request for Review with the Public Access Counselor by writing to:

If you choose to file a Request for Review with the Public Access Counselor, you must do so within 60 calendar days of the date of this letter. Please note that you must include a copy of your original FOIA request and this letter when filing a Request for Review with the Public Access Counselor.

You are also notified that you have the right to judicial review regarding the decision made by the Village of Elmwood Park Freedom of Information Officer pursuant to Section 11 of FOIA.

INFORMATION FOR THE POLICE

THE INFORMATION BELOW IS CONFIDENTIAL - FOR USE BY AUTHORIZED PERSONNEL ONLY

On August 15, 2016, at 1545 hours, I responded to the Public Safety Building for a report.

Upon my arrival, I met [REDACTED] F [REDACTED] and her daughter [REDACTED] F [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] told me at or about the end of the month of June 2016, she was directed to the home care services of Best In-Home Care for services to be provided to herself and her spouse, [REDACTED] M [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] told me the services were to assist [REDACTED] who suffered from a stroke and [REDACTED] who is elderly and needs assistance with everyday living.

[REDACTED] told me she was directed to Best In-Home by Aging Care Connections who was referred by the Illinois Department of Aging.

[REDACTED] told me the nurse assistant assigned to her home for [REDACTED] and herself were suppose to physically move [REDACTED] to the bathroom, observe [REDACTED] at meals, and assist [REDACTED] with providing care at the time in need.

[REDACTED] told me the nurse assistant assigned for 10 to 15 days was a woman by the name of, "Brittany."

[REDACTED] told me "Brittany" was late 1 to 2 hours at times, slept when she should have been observing [REDACTED] used her cellular phone which distracted "Brittany" from work, frequent breaks, and handled [REDACTED] without the appropriate physical care when moved, and pointed her finger in [REDACTED] face and stated "You are not my boss!"

[REDACTED] told me "Brittany" abandoned her duties at times when she left for the day several hours before her scheduled end of duty, being 5pm.

I spoke to [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] told me she has made several complaints to Best In-Home, Aging Care Connections, and the Department of Aging for the State of Illinois.

[REDACTED] told me to date, nothing has been done other than Aging Care Connections suspended services for [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] on July 15, 2016.

[REDACTED] told me she does not live with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] contacted [REDACTED] daily and informed of the cruel and unprofessional care they experienced.

[REDACTED] told me she has contacted the supervisors at Best In-Home:

[REDACTED] who were both made aware of the services by "Brittany" and another assistant nurse "Janiya," who only worked a day, July 12, 2016.

I spoke to [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] told me after her experiences with "Brittany" and "Janiya," she suffers from: Anxiety, chest pains, abdominal pains, and loss of sleep.

[REDACTED] requested that I document the above incident.

I gave the report number to [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] left the station.

I notified sergeant Brown of this incident.

I will fax a copy of this report to the Illinois Department of Aging.
