## Spring playschool classes are back!



Spring playschool classes for three, four and five-year-olds are right around the corner at the Parks & Recreation Center in the Village Circle. Morning classes run from 9:00 - 11:00 am and afternoon classes run from 12:30 - 2:30 pm. Sessions are offered two days a week, either on Tuesday and Thursday or on Wednesday and Friday.

"The playschool program is guided by a philosophy of learning through play," said Playschool Teacher Ms. Amanda. "Our primary vision is to help children develop their love of learning early."

The fee is \$209 per session and runs from February 27/28 through May 16/17. Spring Break will be from March 26 to March 29. Registration is open at the Parks and Recreation office or online at parks.elmwoodpark.org. Parents or guardians must provide the child's birth certificate and proof of immunization when registering. Children must be potty trained and must be the appropriate age when classes begin. No diapers or pull-ups are allowed.



## **Crime prevention tips from Elmwood Park Police**



While Elmwood Park is one of the safest communities in the area, no one is completely immune from crime. Some of the easiest crimes to prevent are motor vehicle theft and thefts from motor vehicles.

To reduce the risk of becoming a victim, we urge residents to remove any valuables from your vehicle, including garage door remotes, house keys and key fobs. Always remember to lock your doors.

Additionally, please read over the following tips to keep your home safe.

- Increase Visibility Criminals do not like to be seen! Keep shrubs trimmed no taller than 3 feet and trees no lower than 7 feet. Use lighting at night to illuminate your home's exterior.
- Surveillance Cameras Installing surveillance cameras has never been easier or more affordable. Surveillance video helps police investigate crimes and arrest criminals. The Village of Elmwood Park will reimburse residents 50% up to \$100 of the camera cost. (See Camera Program at www.elmwoodpark.org).
- Security Systems Along with surveillance cameras, a security system adds a layer of protection to your home. Many systems offer burglar and fire protection alarms.
- Timers A home that looks occupied is less likely to be targeted for crime.

  Use home automation and timers to make it appear someone is home even when you're out.
- Going on Vacation Ask a trusted neighbor to watch your home, pick up mail or packages, or park their vehicle in your driveway. Residents can also sign up for our Vacation Watch Program (call (708) 453-2137).

#### Winter in Elmwood Park

Winter is officially here and with the season comes bad weather. Please remember to keep all your sidewalks clear of snow and ice. Additionally, during this time year, keep in mind that the lids of the garbage containers need to be closed and garbage must not be on the ground which attracts rodents. If you are disposing of any bulk furniture and/or appliances, such as a couch, dresser, or stove, please do not put the items in the alley until the night before or day of your garbage pick-up. If you are disposing a mattress, the mattress must be completely wrapped in plastic prior to it being put out for trash collection.



Landlords must supply sufficient heat for tenants

Colder weather is here and all landlords are reminded of the requirement to supply heat to tenants from September 14 through June 1, as required by the Village Property Maintenance Code, Section 602.3. Please call Code Administration at (708) 452-3920 for more information.

## A message from your Public Works Department

Winter is here and your Public Works Department has a few simple reminders so everyone can enjoy a safe winter season.

Winter storms can bring with them extreme cold temperatures, high winds, freezing rain and lots of snow, all of which can make our roads and sidewalks hazardous to navigate. That is why it is important to everyone at the Public Works Department that we all work together to keep you, your family, your home and the Village safe.

- Please be aware of all snow parking restrictions after a storm. These restrictions are to allow snowplow trucks to safely plow and salt the streets. This is important not only for the mobility of emergency vehicles but residents and visitors to our community.
- Please try to clear sidewalks quickly after a storm. Icy patches may need to be salted and please be mindful of neighbors that may need help.
- We will be out battling every snow or ice event as quickly, safely and efficiently as possible, but storms are unpredictable. Please give yourself extra time to get to work or school.
- As the cold temperatures come in, it causes the ground to freeze. Unfortunately, sometimes this causes water main breaks. We will do our best to get them fixed as soon as possible with no interruptions to your water services in most cases.
- Please register for Village of Elmwood Park calls to get up to date information on any winter parking restrictions.

#### **Curbside snow removal**



The Village is again preparing for a snowy winter by implementing its curbside snow removal plan this season. The program is designed to speed the process of clearing Elmwood Park streets after a snowfall of two inches or greater.

"The curbside snow removal plan has proven a tried and true method for clearing streets for residents in a fast and efficient manner," Public Works Director Peter Guenther. "Hopefully we won't have to implement it too often this winter, but we'll be ready if we do."

If there is a snowfall of two inches or more and the center lanes of residents' streets have been plowed, residents will then be notified of the curbside snow removal plan via Blackboard Connect, which sends out automated phone calls, emails and text alerts.

If curbside snow removal is set to begin on an ODD-numbered date, no parking would be allowed on the side of streets with ODD-numbered addresses between 8:00 am and 5:00 pm that day. The following day, no parking would be allowed on the side of streets with even-numbered addresses.

EXAMPLE: The Village notifies residents that Curbside Snow Removal is set to begin on December 20. No parking would be allowed on the even-numbered side of the streets that day between 8:00 am and 5:00 pm. On December 21, vehicles would not be permitted to park on the odd-numbered side of the streets.

Parking restrictions on curbside snow removal days apply to all Village streets, with the exception of Harlem, Belmont, Grand and North Avenues.

Failure to comply with these restrictions could result in cars being towed at the owner's expense along with a fine of \$50. Residents can call the snow removal hotline number at (708) 395-4040.

Firefighters need snow cleared at least three feet around a hydrant with a snow-cleared path from the hydrant to the street. Anyone observing a hydrant covered with snow should call the Fire Department at (708) 453-2600 so workers can be sent to clear it.

Don't hurry, vote early

In preparation for the Presidential Primary Election March 19, 2024, Elmwood Park Village Hall will again host early voting. Village Hall will be open March 4 to March 18 from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm. Hours on Sunday,



March 10 and Sunday, March 17 will be from 10:00 am – 4:00 pm. Election Day voting on March 19 will be conducted at your local precinct polling place from 6:00 am to 7:00 pm.

New residents may register to vote during Early Voting, Election Day at your polling place, or online until March 3, 2024, on the State Board of Elections website https://ova.elections.il.gov/. To register, you must be a United States Citizen and must be 17 years old on or before the date of the primary election.

## Get help with snow removal

Elmwood Park seniors can get help with snow removal through the Village of Elmwood Park. The Village maintains a list of high school students interested in shoveling snow which is available on request. Call



Senior Coordinator Tina Gordon at (708) 261-1154 or the Village Hall at (708) 452-7300 to request names and contact information of students or more information about the program.

Rates start at \$10 for a normal snowfall of 3 inches or less. Corner lots start at \$15. This includes sidewalks around the house and stairs. Driveways and garages are **not** included. Any additional work is negotiable.

## **Elmwood Park Senior Snow Voucher Program**

The Snow Voucher Program provides assistance to Elmwood Park senior citizens and residents with disabilities living in single family homes.

After a snow fall of 6 inches or more, participants will receive an automated call from the Village of Elmwood Park that the snowfall is eligible for voucher use. Residents contact a student who will shovel snow. A voucher is given to the student for reimbursement through the program.
